Year 3 Poder and Harris

Investigation in focus:

Three quarters of the Earth is covered by it. It is home to both the world's smallest and largest animals. It is found in various forms all over our planet. The availability of fresh quantities of it is the crucial factor to the survival of so much of our natural world. What is it? **Water of course!** During this unit, children will discover that water, even though recyclable, is very precious. They will learn that water is the very existence of all living things. They will identify exactly how different living things rely on water to survive. Children will investigate what we can all do to ensure the protection of this most integral resource.

Their Investigative Question -

Why is water so important?

On the second last day of the term, the classes of **Mrs Poder** and **Ms Harris** will be going on an excursion to the Mooloolaba Spit. The children will enjoy an education tour of Underwater World before walking to the Mooloolaba Harbour where they will see facilities and services of the Water Police, Coast Guard, Harbour & Marine, The Mooloolaba Pilot Boat Station and the Fishing Cooperative. The children will enjoy a lunch of fish 'n' chips and an ocean swim before returning back to school.

Also in the last week of term, the year 4 classes of **Mrs Fuller** and **Mr Clynick** will be involved in a scientific field study at the University of the Sunshine Coast. The classes will be working with their teachers and staff from the Bilai Environmental Education Centre to study and collect data and samples of native plant and animal life. This activity supports their current classroom investigation entitled 'What can we learn traveling Australia?'

Tomorrow is our annual **Year 1 'Generation Picnic'**. **Due to continuing wet weather**, this event will now be held in our school hall. (A note will be going home today regarding this change). The picnic is, historically, a very well supported event where parents, grandparents, uncles, aunts, etc can spend some time celebrating the class work of their year 1 child. Children and their guests picnic together, while the child gets the opportunity to show off their classwork and to hear stories of their guest's childhood. A lovely day out that doubles as a rich experience that the child can write about back in class.

Senior School Opening

“Tomorrow, Today”

On Tuesday, April 4, the Premier, The Hon Peter Beattie, will be at the Secondary Campus of the College to officially open the Senior School and to welcome our students into the senior phase of learning. This is a very exciting stage in our development as a P-12 educational site. The Primary Campus sends its best wishes to our colleagues and fellow students in the Senior School.

The opening will take place from 11am to 12pm when the Premier will be available to attend. Via technology there will be link ups between the Senior, Middle and Primary Campuses as well as the ICT Centre at the University of the Sunshine Coast. Due to the timeframe school leaders and volunteer class groups at the Primary Campus will share their technology expertise from the Blue Hall. Other students will be able to access highlights of the event via our digital technology that can be incorporated into our normal assemblies and class lessons.

P-2 Lunch Eating Trial

Our Preschool, Transition, Year 1 and Year 2 teachers have been trialling a monitored eating time in class areas. This has allowed teachers to check that students are eating appropriately to maximise their learning time.

At play time in preparation for the Preparatory Year introduction in 2007, year 1's and transition students have had play access to the Preschool play areas as our break times are now aligned. Year 6 monitors have been trained to support this program. Students in other year levels are not allowed to play in this area as there would be too many students and would disadvantage the younger students' access to play equipment. Students who wish to visit a sibling must get permission from the staff member on duty. As we are now nearly at the end of Term 1 we encourage siblings to support the younger students in gaining independence by limiting visit times.

It has been great to see the Preschoolers, Transition and Year 1 students interacting in a positive way during play. There will be some further alterations to play areas as we prepare for the redesign of some areas to support the Preparatory program facilities preparation phase.
