Assessment and Reporting of Your Child's Performance.

Last term's formal parent/teacher interviews were again, very successful and we had a great number of parents who took this opportunity to discuss their child's progress with their teacher. We would like however, to ensure that all parents understand that our teachers welcome you to make an appointment to see them at anytime during the school term.

Later this term, teachers will be writing formal reports that will be sent home in the first week of term 3. This year's written reports will show your child's progress on a new 5 point rating scale. A flyer will be sent home in the coming weeks that will discuss this scale in greater detail.

In the next fortnight all classes will be doing a common writing task in their classes. This common task will enable teachers to continue their conversations about year level standards and will assist us to ensure a consistency of judgment from teacher to teacher.

**STRICT GUIDELINES FOR MEDICINES IN SCHOOLS**

Strict new procedures have been developed by the Queensland Government regarding prescription and over-the-counter medication in schools. Our school is committed to working closely with parents and students to highlight the risk of students misusing these medications.

All parents/caregivers must:

- Notify our school in writing of a health condition requiring medication at school
- Request in writing if school staff are to administer medication or assist in the management of a health condition
- Notify our school in writing of any requests and/or guidelines from medical practitioners including potential side effects or adverse reactions
- Provide the medication in the original labelled container to the nominated staff member
- Ensure the medication is not out of date and has an original pharmacy label with the student's name, dosage and time to be taken
- Notify our school in writing when a change of dosage is required. This instruction must be accompanied by a letter from a medical practitioner
- Advise our school in writing and collect the medication when it is no longer required at school
